- Determination to see continuous standards raised & progress made by all pupils
- Agreeing the overall aims of the school
- Agreeing and monitoring policies
- Agreeing and monitoring the school budget and salaries
- Asking questions to check on progress
- Making sure the National Curriculum is being taught
- Checking that the school encourages pupils' spiritual, moral and cultural development, and that pupils' Special Needs are being met
- Helping in the appointment of senior staff
- Ensuring the buildings are properly maintained
